Organized to address and solicit input to provide the basis for developing a long-term master plan to guide future park improvements, Atlanta-based HGOR principal Bob Hughes facilitated the workshop with guided topics for discussion and ample community feedback.

Topics discussed included trails with safe lighting and material to allow all types of users, support of a connected passive park around golf and tennis, long term maintenance and management plan for the Park, future use of the clubhouse, and support for maintaining Woodward & pedestrian connectivity through a raised Northside bridge.

- Recap shared via AMPC eblast: Organized to address and solicit input to provide the basis for developing a long-term master plan to guide future park improvements, Atlanta-based HGOR principal Bob Hughes and Ron Thomas facilitated the workshop. Nearly 100 attendees gathered at North Atlanta High School from adjacent neighborhoods, including the Bobby Jones golf and Bitsy Grant tennis communities, to discuss the following four key issues as it relates to Atlanta Memorial Park, Bitsy Grant Tennis Center, Bobby Jones Golf Course and the historic grounds and parklands:
 - Park setting, environment and image
 - Creek, trails and leisure activities
 - Tennis for success
 - Golf as Bobby Jones would have it

Seated at tables in groups of eight, participants were guided in discussion by a professional facilitator at each table who encouraged them to put forth one item which created the most energy and importance from their discussions.

These items were then listed and voted on using electronic keypad voting on an individual basis. Votes were tabulated instantly, and the results were projected for all to see.

Topics discussed included connectivity and greenspace, safety, long-term management, golf options, expanded tennis and possible cluster of golf & tennis pro shops.
